The Anthroposophical Society in Great Britain is based at Rudolf Steiner House and is part of the General Anthroposophical Society founded by Rudolf Steiner.



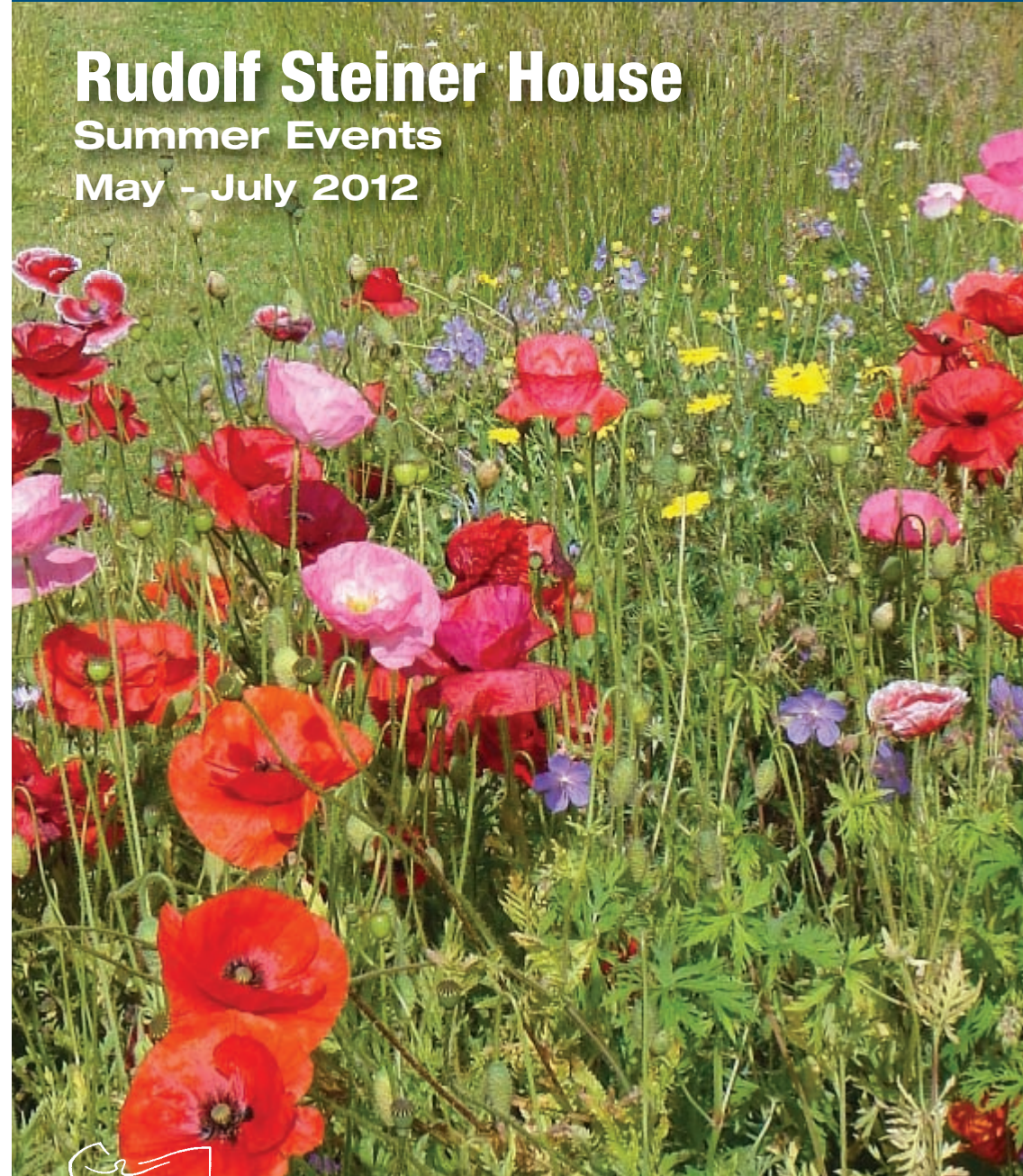
Goetheanum designed by Rudolf Steiner

With so much suffering all around us in almost every part of our world it feels impossible to make any difference. Will this be our future? A world of suffering, fear and hatred and no one left with courage for change. Out of the indications offered by Rudolf Steiner for how we can be responsible for our social future Tessabella Lovemore will describe the ways

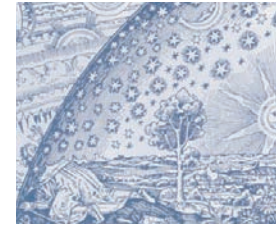


in which we can begin to create reservoirs of strength and courage.

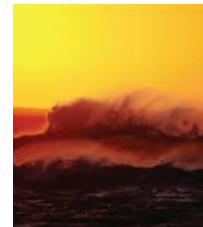


Eric Klein is a musician, workshop leader and lecturer, with a lifelong interest in Anthroposophy.

12 June – Susan J. Raven Reading in the Great Book of Nature

One of the most pressing assignments facing our newly awakening consciousness is the healing of our environment. The nature spirits and elementals are waiting to be reunited with us, and as emissaries of higher spiritual beings, they wish to be of great assistance to us at this time, but we have to step into their world and meet them in their own territory. Now is the time to relearn a living world wisdom from the elemental kingdom.

Susan J. Raven is a long time student of Anthroposophy and has represented the Anthroposophical Society at the Mind, Body and Spirit festivals in the UK for 14 years. In this talk Susan will be suggesting ways in which we can enhance our own relationship with the nature spirits, and she will be recounting her own experiences with the elemental kingdom in the uplands of mid-Wales.



19 June – Spencer Christy Biodynamics – Self Sustaining Agriculture

Biodynamics is a whole farm approach that seeks to manage the soils, crops, and animals on a farm in such a way that the enterprises on a farm strengthen and support each other. This talk will give a brief introduction to some of the history and philosophy of biodynamic agriculture and then look in more detail at the preparations and the planting calendar giving examples of the experience at Lauriston Farm. *Spencer Christy started farming in 2004 at his parents' farm on the Blackwater Estuary in Essex. He began on a quarter acre plot learning about and experimenting with the Biodynamic methods and he now looks after 210 acres of Demeter certified farmland. The farm is home to cattle, sheep, chickens, bees, vegetables, fruits, education and conservation.*



26 June – Andrew Wolpert Biographical Alchemy

What can we do with the remembered past so as to be ready for the unknown future? How can we prepare for the unpredictable? Books 3 and 9 of Wolfram von Eschenbach's epic Parzival, and Chapters 3 and 9 of Rudolf Steiner's Philosophy of Freedom offer us challenging contrasts in our striving to meet the responsibilities of our destiny. *Andrew Wolpert lectures on Anthroposophy and Art History in the UK and Europe.*

3 July – Terry Boardman Understanding East-West Tensions in 2012

As we enter the second decade of the 21st century, what forces are creating tensions in East-West relations? How can spiritual science help us to understand them and serve to resolve the tensions? This talk will focus on the Islamic world, China and 'the Great Game' Mk II. *Terry Boardman, a writer, lecturer and translator, is a long-term student of Anthroposophy.*

The content of the Anthroposophical Christmas Conference of 1923/24 indicated how the Holy Spirit will carry such a Whitsun message into the new mysteries inaugurated by Rudolf Steiner. We are all beggars for the spirit for this deeper spiritual understanding. The Holy Spirit goes with us now on our own spiritual journey of brotherhood.

Virginia Gilmer is a music teacher, composer and painter whose connection with Anthroposophy goes back two generations, through her mother and her grandparents.

1 June - David Lowe

The Changing Face of Christ

Consideration of the attempts of artists to depict the Christ in the catacombs, imperial Ravenna and the art of the Renaissance reveal to us our changing relationship to the events of two thousand years ago. With slides.

David Lowe lectures in the UK and the USA on Art History and its relationship to human consciousness. He is author of 'Goethe, Palladio and the Discovery of Metamorphosis'.



15 June - Dr. Brien Masters

'He is not here' Where is He? The dilemma of the Christian churches

Emmaus, Damascus and Patmos ring out at the inception of post-Crucifixion Christianity like the three mighty chords at the opening of Mozart's The Magic Flute. Less than a millennium later follows the drastic spiritual irrelevance of the established church, the aftershocks of which rumble on in today's fundamentalisms and the continuing secularisation of society.

In this talk, Brien Masters, whose religious roots are in Anglicanism where he met and began his lifelong engagement with Anthroposophy, will enter into the fray with a cautiously upbeat musical baton, culminating in illustrations from Richard Wagner's Parsifal, with references to Rudolf Steiner's perceptions of the future role of music. Through this, he aims to shed light on the problem that Christ has been moulded into the 'subject' of religion.

22 June - Philip Martyn

The Working-out of the Christ Impulse

This lecture will examine what happened to the Christ Impulse during the last 2000 years and how it will continue to work on into the future.

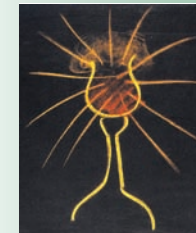
Philip Martyn is Joint General Secretary of the Anthroposophical Society in Great Britain. He worked in the City for many years before his retirement.

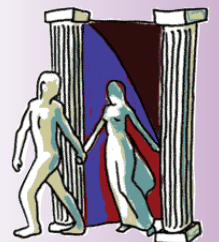

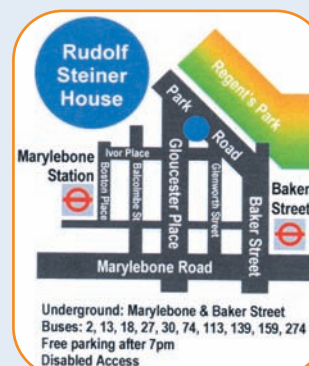
